ABSTRACT

The Background: In Indonesia, up until 2018, the number of reports was 327,782. One of those who have the greatest risk is female sex workers. Therefore, this study will assess HIV / AIDS prevention knowledge and attitudes of female sex workers.

The Purpose: This literature review aimed to explore the knowledge and attitudes of HIV / AIDS Prevention in Female Sexual Workers.

The Sample: This study used 1,172 female sex workers as samples

The Methods: Summarizing the various literature / articles relevant to the research topic. The articles used was from 2 databases, namely PubMed and Google Scholar. Then the researcher entered the keywords, namely "HIV / AIDS knowledge and HIV / AIDS prevention attitudes among female sex workers" and "HIV / AIDS knowledge and attitude prevention HIV / AIDS among female sex workers".

The Results: The results showed that 742 respondents had good knowledge (63%) and the respondents had poor knowledge as many as 430 (37%). And the results of respondents with good preventive attitudes were 657 (56%) and bad preventive attitudes were 515 (54%).

The Conclusion: Respondents with good knowledge were 63%. It was found that most of the respondents had a good preventive attitude with a percentage of 56%.
